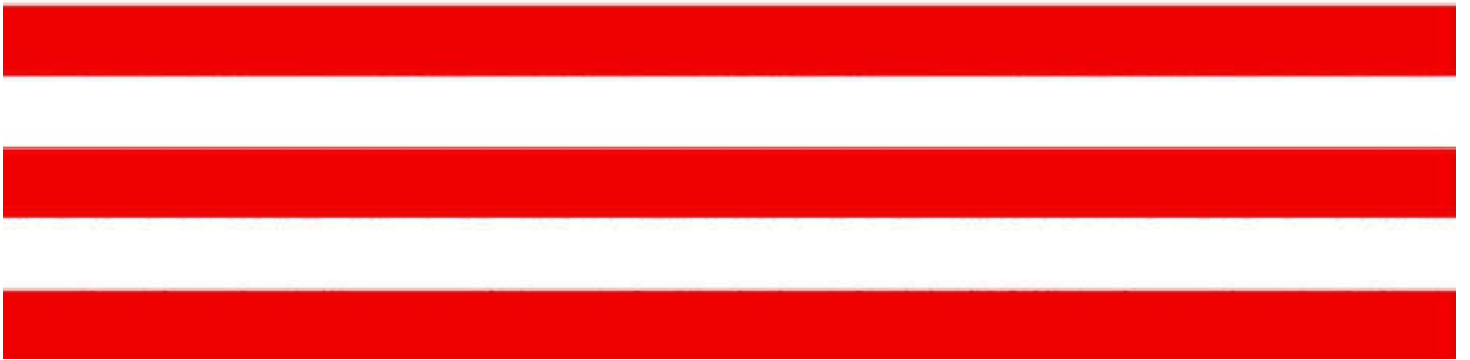

SUMMER WORK & TRAVEL USA PROGRAM

The J-1 work program is an Exchange Visitor Program created by the Mutual Educational and Cultural Exchange Act of 1961 to promote mutual understanding between Americans and citizens of the countries through interchange of persons, knowledge and skills in different fields of specialization.

The program offers foreign nationals the opportunity to participate in educational and cultural programs in the United States and to share their experiences with their home countries upon their return.

This program enables selected and qualified full time university students to gain a greater understanding and appreciation of the way of life in the United States through temporary employment. Participants are able to obtain personal insight into United States work culture, job ethics and to improve their English Language skills. The program also provides them with the opportunity to work alongside their American peers, make new friends and travel to other parts of United States after completing the job assignments.

The WWCE Summer Work & Travel Program provides international students currently attending university in their home country the opportunity to live and work in the United States for up to four months during the student's summer break.

The summer break is generally during the months of May to September for countries in the Northern Hemisphere and during the months of November to March from countries in the Southern Hemisphere. By providing this opportunity to international university students, it is expected that they will gain knowledge and experience of America and other cultures through daily living experiences. It is also expected that you, as an international exchange visitor will share your culture with the Americans you come into contact with. Participants on the program obtain a J-1 cultural exchange visa from the US Consulate in their home country.

The work component of this program does not necessarily cover the students' expenses; students should understand that this is a cultural exchange program, not a way of making big money for the summer.

? FOR WHO ?

Application is open to bonafide international students currently enrolled in post secondary programs in their home countries, and who will be available for up to 4 months during the summer.

These students are screened for appropriate English language fluency, ability to function in a work environment and motivation to get maximum benefit from Summer Work & Travel Program.

Applicants are to choose a program prior to the interview, complete their application process with the country representative and will be interviewed specifically for participation in the program.

Participants must be:

- Between the ages of 18-28 years old.
- A current full-time university student in their home country and have completed at least one semester program of post secondary study and not completed the final year of study.
- Able to prove an intermediate level of English through one or multiple interviews in English.
- Genuinely interested in learning about the culture of the United States.
- Have no criminal convictions.

Full service application to participate in the Summer Work & Travel Program includes;

- Visa documents processing necessary for securing a J-1 visa.
- International Student support throughout the duration of the program. The Team Assist Plan is designed by Cultural Insurance Services International and participants are covered by comprehensive medical insurance while in the United States.
- Mandatory program application package to be completed with the local representative at a fee.
- Mandatory pre-selection orientation seminar session and interview with WWCE partner and representative in the participant's home country.
- Mandatory interview session with the Host Company (Universal Studios Hollywood, Universal Orlando Resort, Six Flags Magic Mountain) in the participant's home country.
- ONE job offer containing details of hours, pay, uniform, housing deposits, etc.
- Airport "meet & greet" service for group arrivals. Transportation can be arranged nominally for a fee.
- Accommodation arrangements for the duration of the student's stay.
- Mandatory orientation program with arrival materials within no more than two days of the arrival.
- Support in applying for a Social Security card, opening a bank account, securing a cell phone, etc.

INTERNSHIPS IN HOSPITALITY

The Internship program in Hospitality operates under the J-1 Work program designated by the US Department of State to give international students and graduates of hospitality related field of studies an opportunity for work and on-the-job study opportunities in the US.

? FOR WHO ?

Application is open to bonafide international students currently enrolled in or graduates of hospitality degree programs in their home countries, and who will be available for more than 6 months.

These students are screened for appropriate English language fluency, ability to function in a work environment and motivation to get maximum benefit from Internship Program.

Participants must be:

- Between the ages of 18-28 years old.
- A current full-time university student in their home country and have completed at least one year program of post secondary study and/or completed the final year of study within the last 12 – 18 months.
- Able to prove an intermediate level of English through one or multiple interviews in English.
- Genuinely interested in learning about the culture of the United States.
- Have no criminal convictions.

Full service application to participate in the Hospitality Internship Program includes;

- Visa documents processing necessary for securing a J-1 visa.
- International Student support throughout the duration of the program. The Team Assist Plan is designed by Cultural Insurance Services International and participants are covered by comprehensive medical insurance while in the United States.
- Mandatory program application package to be completed with the local representative at a fee.

INTERNSHIPS & TRAINEESHIPS IN ARTS AND MANAGEMENT

US Arts International Training and Internship Program places international and United States students and post-graduates with arts and culture related organizations to complete valuable on-the-job training and internship placements in the US. They sponsor international trainees for the J1 visa and monitors both American and international trainees throughout their training placements. We accept applicants from a wide variety of performing and visual arts as well as business management fields for J 1 visa sponsorship and internships in the USA.

As part of the International Training Program, International Arts and Artists is a designated J1 Trainee visa sponsor and issues the documents necessary to apply for the J1 Trainee visa. They provide valuable support throughout the J1 visa application process, helping candidates to understand and complete the application procedures once the training placement has been arranged.

Previous and current hosts have included Undercover Fashion in Santa Monica, CA, the Queens Museum of Art in New York, the Smithsonian American Art Museum in Washington, DC, the Bass Museum of Art in Miami Beach, FL, the Washington National Opera, the Stockton Symphony Association in Stockton, CA, CLIMB Theatre in Minnesota, ACA Galleries in New York City, and Jo Lance Photography studio in New York, BlueWater Media in Washington DC, and the Houston Center for Contemporary Craft.

BASIC REQUIREMENTS

- **Completed at least two years of post-secondary education**
- **Fluency in English (written and verbal)**
- **Your intended area of training should be related to your academic field of study OR you must be able to demonstrate a strong personal interest in the arts**
- **Must be able to provide adequate funds for the entire duration of your stay either through payment from an employer or personal funds**
- **A passport valid for 6 months after the date of your intended return**

Health Insurance

It is a legal requirement that you must have Health Insurance for the entire duration of your training plus one additional month (30 days) after the expiry of your J1 visa. IA&A offers Health Insurance from \$44-\$74 per month depending on age. Participants are welcome to obtain their own health insurance but the policy must meet U.S. State Department regulations.

PRAXIS International Institute offers University Preparatory classes through High School study opportunities starting from Grade 10. After three years study with Saskatchewan curriculum in Praxis (Grade 10-12), the students will obtain Canadian high school diploma and can apply to universities in North America directly (just the same as local Canadian students) without taking any English efficiency test.

Applicants for 11th or 12th grade can apply as well, in which case, we will get the student's grade 10 transcripts to be evaluated by Saskatchewan Province Learning Department and see how many extra credits student needs to study in order to obtain Saskatchewan high school diploma. Flexibility is applied to individual students' application and the best suitable way for students' study is ensured accordingly.

Praxis International Institute offers each student a comprehensive and fulfilling education experience, delivered by highly qualified teachers. Students are also assisted to get acquainted with Canada, and a variety of activities such as weekend field trips, sports, drama, cultural celebration etc will help the students feel at home. With the provision of small class sizes, the learning process is better facilitated. Students will also receive training in Environmental Issues, Inter-cultural Communication, Technology, Community Experience, Entrepreneurship/Intrapreneurship, Holistic Development etc.

We at Badabeat Associates understand that it will take some time for young international students to adapt to a new environment in a different country at the beginning. Normally for the first year, students are struggling to obtain good record of scores for the whole academic year in their courses and Praxis focuses on the practical projects that are related to the academic courses, i.e. learning by doing, so that students can find their own way to learn and practice.

Also available is Student Exchange Program for long term program (one semester or one year), the curriculum and activities are the same as our normal high school program; students will obtain course credits for what they learn in Praxis.

For short-term program (say three months), the program are customized so that students might take fewer classes but spend more time in each class and they could actually get credit for work they do within three month window.

GERMAN EDUCATIONAL TRAVEL PROGRAMS

SUMMER AND YOUTH LANGUAGE CAMPS

The course centre is located in the middle of Berlin, just a stone throw from the main shopping area of West Berlin. You will be together with other young people from all over the world in small groups and will learn to speak fluent

German quicker than you ever imagined!

The language course is full of fun activities and uses modern hands-on teaching methods, so that even in a short space of time you will make great progress.

Afternoon Programme: After the completion of morning courses our young, dynamic team will make sure you have a great time with a full programme of organized afternoon activities both in and around Berlin! Close to the institute there are shops, cafes, parks, plenty of city sights and the Berlin zoo while the City of Berlin and nearby Potsdam offer hundreds of opportunities for exciting activities and excursions. A variety of activities are on offer such as city-tours, excursions to Potsdam and other places of historical interest, barbecues, discos, concerts, sports, special creativity workshops, DVD evenings, trips to museums and galleries, 3D-cinema and even to the beach (yes Berlin does have one!!). All teen activities are accompanied by pedagogically qualified staff.

Accommodation: Various accommodation solutions are available. For groups, accommodation is organized in shared rooms in a youth hostel. Small groups share a room. The group leader lives in the hostel for the duration of the course, ensuring the safety and well-being of the group around the clock. Single-rooms are also available for participants at an extra price, if required. For individual applicants, we also offer a host-family option, enabling you to experience German family life for the duration of the course and giving you a unique insight into German culture.

Note for parents: please note that in this case the trips to and from school will NOT be accompanied.

After class and a short lunchtime, the EURASIA team mentors spend the afternoons together with our language students. The afternoon programme consists of a mixture of sightseeing, (e.g. museums, the Berlin Wall, zoological gardens) and social activities such as going to the cinema, sports afternoons at the Institute or picnics followed by volleyball tournaments in the park.

Not forgetting of course, our weekly visit to the disco altogether. Any entrance fees have to be paid for in advance by the students themselves.

The Institute lays particular importance on mutual interaction between students. Many activities are based on this standpoint of encouraging communication between students and promoting the desire for intercultural exchange. It is therefore quite common for friendships to continue long after time spent at the Institute.

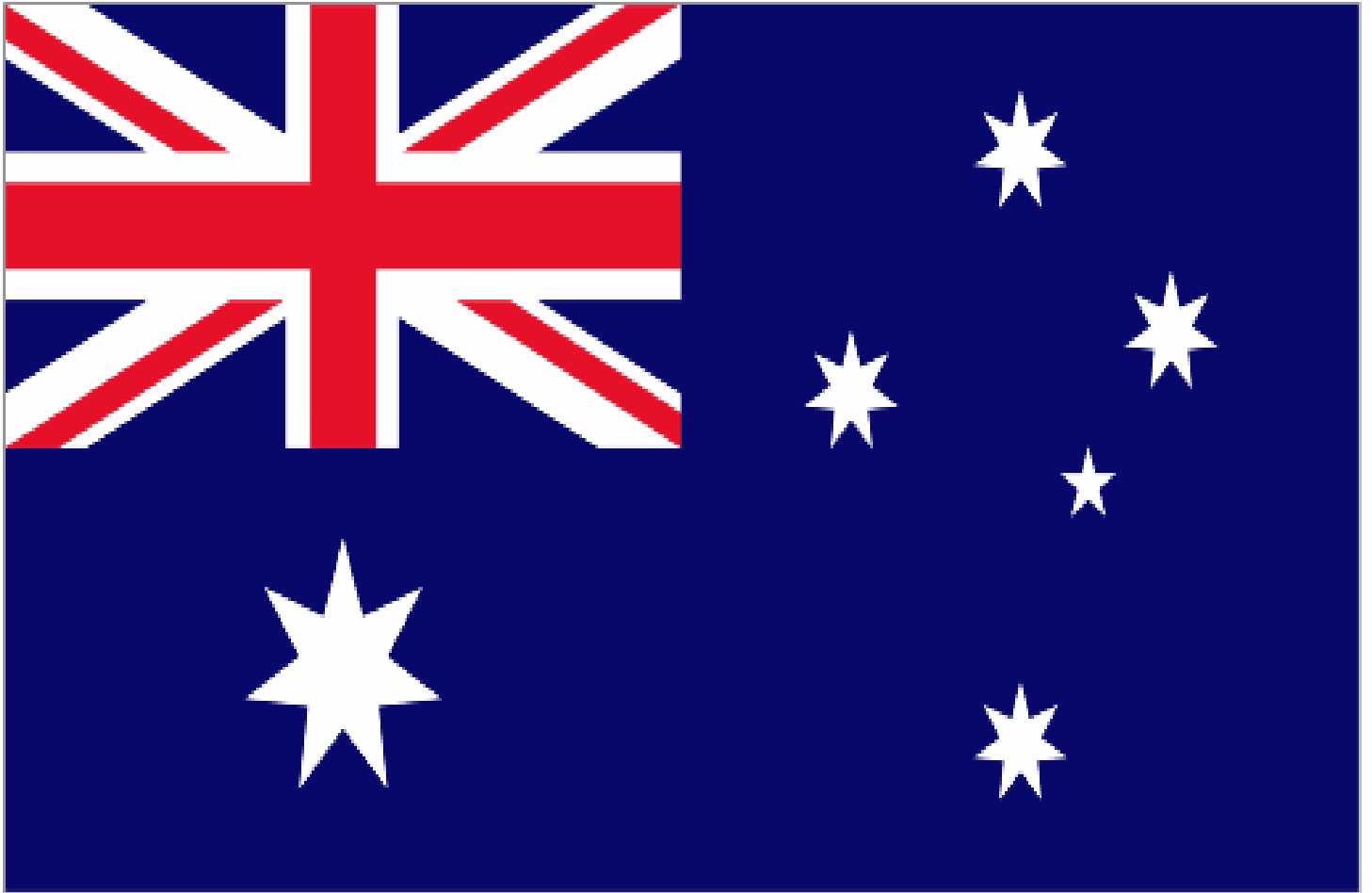
In each of the modules, we elucidate the theoretical (30%) and practical aspects (70%) of the particular focus theme. The standard length of the course is 1 week but this may be extended to 4 weeks. It is also possible to conclude the 4-week course with a paper given on one of the focus topics, recapitulating the theoretical and practical insights gained. The papers are presented to the group at the end of the course and may possibly be accepted for credits at the university in the student's home country. At the Institute, qualified tutor supports and directs the project groups.

In the afternoons and evenings, the participants have time to get to know Berlin while special activities can be organized for each group if required.

The package consists of various modules which may be chosen to make your tailor-made programme (per one week):

- Application module: visa documents including health and liability insurance coverage
- Seminar module: 20 academic hours* of seminars, company visits etc. in one of the above modules including course materials
- Excursions module: 2 half-day excursions (each 4 hours) and 1 full-day excursion including entry fees and guide
- Accommodation 7 days and 6 nights' accommodation (host family or hostel) with half-board)
- Transfer Airport Transfer Service costs 75€ per transfer by public transport and 200 € per transfer in a hired coach
- Interpreter (Groups bringing their own interpreter must pay the application fee and accommodation for this person extra) - If the group has no interpreter then we will provide one at an additional Cost of 1000 € +19% German sales tax per group per week (20 hours).

*Accompanying group leaders will only be charged for accommodation and application fee but not for the programme

PAID HOSPITALITY INTERNSHIPS

This program was developed to comply with the Australian Department of Immigration and Multicultural and Indigenous Affairs (DIMIA) visa requirements. This information designed to assist you to understand some of the visa options available for interns coming to Australia.

This internship is in the hospitality sector.

The organizations we place interns at are located all over Australia, for example; Brisbane, Gold Coast, Melbourne, Newcastle, Sydney or Perth.

The average monthly salary for interns is **AUD\$1735**. This wage may vary depending on host companies and intern working hours.

Please note: *we generally only arrange paid internships in Housekeeping, F&B and Culinary arts. All other internships will be non-paid.*

The Department of Immigration advises that it will cost AUD\$1000 per month including housing, food, fun and incidentals.

There is no set time frame for internships and the duration is negotiated with your sponsoring employer however generally employers request a minimum period of one month, with a maximum period offered of 12 months. Each internship program will be developed to accommodate your request.

Accommodation Options

We want you to enjoy your stay in Australia and we are happy to assist with your accommodation arrangements. Following are brief descriptions of the accommodation options available to you:

1. Homestay

Global Choices recommends homestay as a great personal introduction and welcome to the daily life in Australia. Living with an Australian family will give you a unique insight into the culture and values of our country and assist in preparing you for the business environment.

All homestay families are carefully selected and keen to ensure you enjoy your visit to Australia. After indicating your homestay preferences, Global Choices will take the time to make sure that you have a homestay provided to meet your specific needs.

The fees for homestay vary and are influenced by your choice of location however please refer to the price section for details on the homestay rates. If you choose this option when you first arrive you will be asked to pay four weeks fees and then you may pay the family directly.

2. Hostels

Many interns prefer to find their own accommodation but they still ask us to arrange initial accommodation for their arrival. Several inexpensive and safe hostels are available in each location. Prices start from AUD\$18 per night or AUD\$125 per week. Specific information will be supplied at your request. For detailed information on hostels please visit www.hostelworld.com

3. Shared Accommodation

Shared accommodation is available in most locations. Many visitors choose to share flats or units with other Australian students or young singles and this option is popular for the independent interns who enjoy their own space. We strongly advise that you take the time to meet and view the premises for a share option after your arrival as they will vary quite dramatically, as will the people providing the accommodation.

What is included in the fee?

- Development of a custom designed internship to meet your individual requirements.
- Internship placement services including supply of essential visa nomination approval documents.
- Supply of an internship contract to define the terms and conditions for the placement.

- Assistance with the visa process.
- Preparation and orientation package prior to departure.
- Regular counseling support services for the duration of your internship.
- Monthly intern newsletter.
- Performance report supplied by the host employer on successful completion of the program.
- Certificate at successful completion of the internship.
- Supply of the necessary documentation to gain academic credit for existing studies.

What is not included in the fee?

- Flight and travel
- Accommodation: You can either arrange this yourself or Global Choices can do it for you for an extra charge.
- Insurance
- Any relevant visa fees for visa processing
- Daily living expenses

OTHER COSTS

You will need to get health and accident.

Eligibility

- 18- 30 years old
- All candidates must have a degree/ certificate/ diploma and experience in the chosen field. Note for most industries it is preferred that candidates have some form of experience however it is not pertinent.
- All interns are required to have sufficient English language skills for effective workplace communication. A guide to the required language level for Interns is TOEFL 550 or IELTS 6 - for more information, please contact us.

Required Documents

- Current Resume or Curriculum Vitae by email
- Evidence of English language level - IELTS 6 or TOEFL 550
- Details of the completed or current studies with academic results from your University
- University/Employer Letter of Internship Support
- Statement of work experience objectives and how the work experience relates to current studies or occupation
- Evidence of financial support or training wage. This may be included in the home university letter, the training body letter or as a separate document. A rough guide could be \$1000 per month.
- Evidence of medical, accident, travel and personal liability insurance.
- Evidence of processing fee payment of GBP 400 at application.

Permits & Visas

All applications should be submitted 4 months prior to preferred entry date.

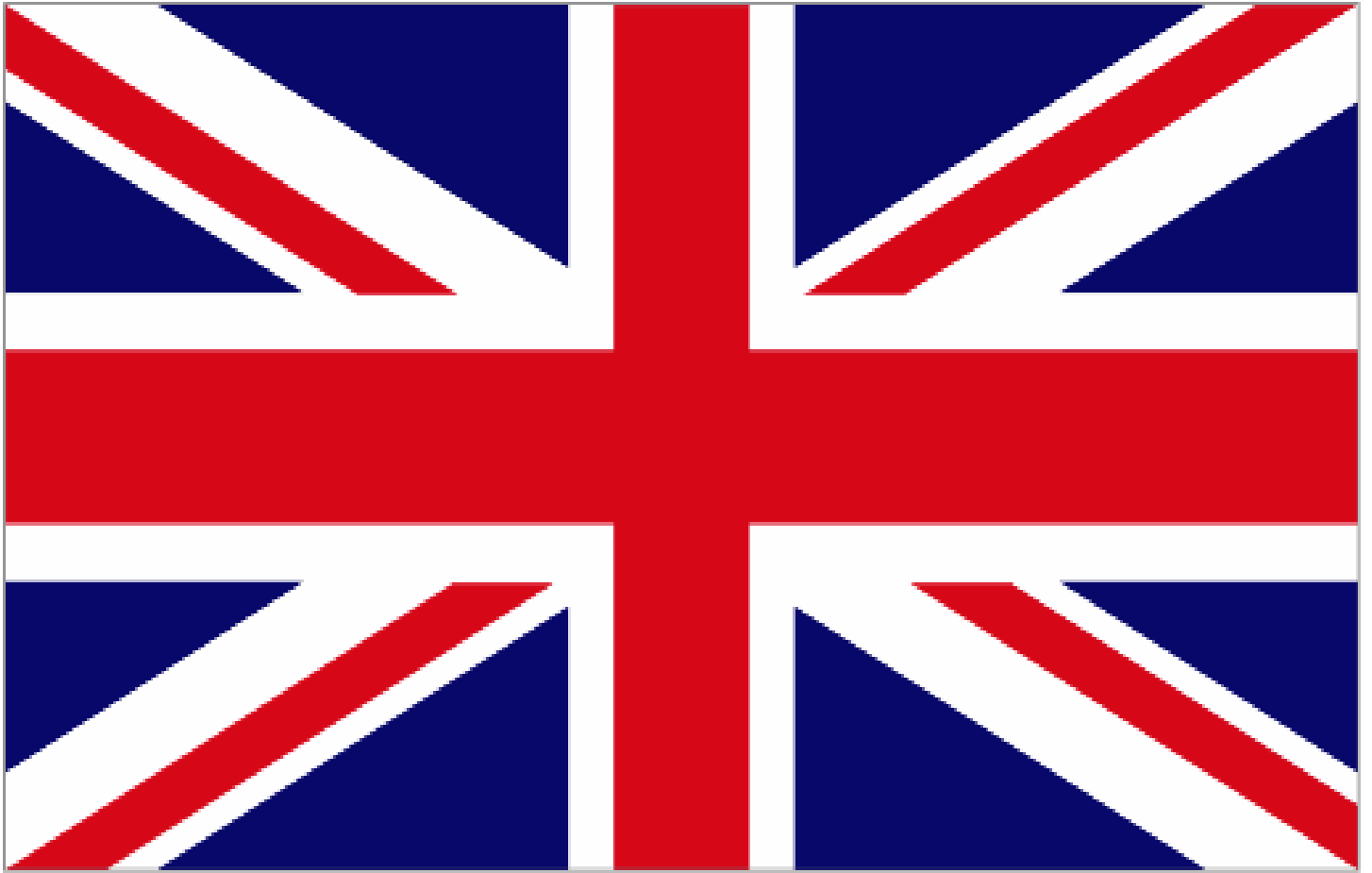

- . Make sure that you comply with additional requirements of British High Commission or British Embassy in your country.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

- . Filled Application form provided by Global Choices;
- . CV (printed in English);
- . 2-passport size photos;
- . Passport photocopy;
- . You will need to get medical and travel insurance. This you can purchase through Global Choices.

WORK PERMITS AND VISA

All citizens of British Commonwealth countries will have to apply for Working Holiday Visa.

HOW TO APPLY?

You should apply at least 8 weeks before you departure.

Steps to take:

1. Fill the application form.
2. Submit all required documents.
3. Pay the booking fee and the program fee.
4. Confirmation letter will be sent to you.
5. Apply for Working Holiday visa.
6. After receiving your visa, confirm your arrival date at least two weeks before departure.
